	(purchased by principal) in staff room. Extra side plates, cutlery, kettle, extension cords with surge protection, smelly candles, chocolate biscuits and teaspoons purchased (by BOM). Extra fridge purchased (through minor works grant) recently. Principal & Chairperson met with architect in school on Sep 9 th to discuss possibility of extension to staffroom/kitchenette through window. Architect quoted ballpark 100k for extra space including engineering works, fire safety, disability regulations etc. Plan postponed for foreseeable future.
	<u>CPD</u> IT Training for new Promethean boards took place on Tuesday 13 th September after school. Secular & Jewish Studies team members were well-represented in this optional training.
